On behalf of the 131 member households of the Vineyards, the Homeowners Association would like to welcome you!

Many new arrivals have a bundle of questions on your new community. We would like to share some key information to help you and your family feel at home.

The Basics

<u>The Vineyards</u> is located in the Town of Smyrna, which has approximately 40,000 residents. The town provides police & fire protection, and Rutherford County provides ambulance and runs the school district. Many newcomers comment on the higher than expected level of service we have grown to expect here, and we hope you find the same.

Electric – Our electric utility is Middle Tennessee Electric Membership Corporation. Phone to set up your service is 877-777-9020 or online at <u>Service Request</u>. They fix our streetlights too.

Gas & Water – Our Gas, Water & Sewer is Smyrna Utilities http://www.townofsmyrna.org. The town website says all new service requires in person visit with photo ID. Their number is 615-355-5740

Trash – Trash pickup is not done by the city of Smyrna. Trash is picked up by independent disposal services. The major players are

All have people who love them and some who do not. In general, rates for our area run between \$15-25 per month charged quarterly. If you negotiate with Republic Services or others for an annual payment option, they tend to drop the payment considerably.

Recycling - is not offered by all and is typically done for a fee. Rutherford County has a free recycling and trash drop off center in Smyrna on Weakley Lane.

Smyrna offers free pickup of tree limbs, leaves etc. You cannot schedule a pickup; the trucks run on a cycle that seems to be about 3 weeks depending on their workload. Make sure your limbs do not block the sidewalks!

TV, Telephone & Internet – The two main companies who authorized for cable in Smyrna are <u>AT&T</u> (which includes DirecTV or U-Verse) and <u>Xfinity</u> (Comcast). Dish also serves the area. Any satellite dish requires approval from the HOA ARC.

Rutherford County schools requires students transferring in, to register to the appropriate zoned school.

Pool Rules – Posted at pool and on our website. Remember the rules are in place to avoid issues and injuries. Each homeowner in HOA has a portion of any liability so please follow the rules!

Keycard Access – At closing for your home, you should receive the pool keycard from the seller. We can simply transfer the card to your name when you complete the Pool Pass form on the website.

ARC – Architectural Review Committee – We strive to maintain an outstanding neighborhood that we are all proud to live in and that offers best potential for improved property values. The ARC is responsible to enforce the covenants of the HOA.

Changes to exterior – Any change should be submitted to ARC to ensure that it conforms to the HOA. Contact ARC via our email - Smyrnavhoa@gmail.com

Property maintenance- lawns, weeding, mailboxes, painting or dirty siding if applicable are typical items that ARC will address if a property becomes lax on their maintenance before it becomes an eyesore. Information on mailbox suppliers is on our website.

They are located about six miles from Vineyards. Smyrna has many parks for a town of our size. Drive around town and discover the variety of options. Paul Johns Neighborhood Park is a nice, small, park nearby.

Street parking - parking on street is permitted during daytime. NO OVERNIGHT PARKING PERMITTED from 1-5AM per Smyrna code. Parking tickets are a bit expensive!

Shrubs – Smyrna Code Section 13-103 stipulates

(3) Bushes, shrubs, hedges, and trees. It shall be unlawful for any owner or tenant of real property to fail to periodically cut and trim any bushes, shrubs, hedges or trees surrounding his residence or buildings so as to allow safe ingress and egress into and from such residence or building by any door or window.

In non-technical language this says, 'keep shrubs below bottom of windows to allow emergency exit or emergency responders to enter in the event of a fire'. The HOA enforces this as part of the ARC as it ties in with general property upkeep.
